

Homophones: To, Two, Too

Homophone is a word that *is pronounced in the same way* as another word but has a *different meaning and spelling*. Examples: four – for, it’s – its, to – two – too

REMEMBER: The word **to** is a *preposition* used to show the place, person, or thing that someone or something moves toward.
The word **two** is a *number*.
The word **too** means *also* or *overly*.
