

Homophones: There, Their, They're

A **homophone** is a word that *is pronounced in the same way* as another word but has a *different meaning and spelling*. Examples: four – for, it's – its, to – two – too

REMEMBER: The word **there** is *an adverb* meaning “at that place.”
The word **their** shows *possession*.
The word **they're** is a *contraction* for the words *they* and *are*.
